Westerners – 'focus on the Western Front

- 1. The war in France and Belgium has become bogged down in a stalemate.
- 2. An attack in the east will force Turkey out of the war.
- 3. It may force the Germans to move some of their troops from the Western Front to support their ally Turkey.
- 4. Sending troops to the East will take men away from fighting the Germans on the Western Front.
- 5. The war can only be won by defeating the vast German Army in France and Belgium.
- 6. This will give us control of the Mediterranean and Black Sea allowing us to link up with our ally, Russia.
- 7. The Dardanelles is well protected by a series of forts.
- 8. It will be hard to supply the army, as Gallipoli is hundreds of miles away from supply depots.
- 9. The Turkish Army has some of its best troops on the Gallipoli peninsula; 84,000 well-equipped men under a German commander.
- 10. The German defences along the Western France are incredibly strong with trenches protected by barbed wire, machine guns and artillery.
- 11. The Royal Navy is a great fighting force and will be able to force its way through the Dardanelles.
- 12. It is easier to supply the British Army in France and Belgium with weapons, equipment and reinforcements.
